## PERSPECTIVE

The Bhopal disaster in 1984 emphasized the need for systematic management of technological disasters, which led the Government to take important measures, with major legislative changes and stronger institutional mechanisms. However, major natural disasters such as the Orissa super-cyclone (1999) and the Bhuj earthquake (2001) emphasised the need for a comprehensive approach to prevention and mitigation, for natural as well as man-made disasters. It is therefore, important that preparedness at corporate level is not only limited to chemical disasters but also to the natural disasters as part of the Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR). This highlights the need for a focused attention on comprehensive Disaster Management by all concerned to arrest the colossal national loss.

Disaster Management has occupied a position of national priority. The Disaster Management Act was enacted in December 2005 for creating mechanism at the National, State and District levels for effective management of disasters. As required under the Act, the Govt. of India has constituted the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) under the Chairmanship of the Hon'ble Prime Minister. NDMA has issued national policies and guidelines for management of different types of disasters including Chemical Disasters. NSC has played a key role as a Member of the Core Group in developing the Guidelines on Chemical Disasters.

NSC's experience and expertise in the field of Disaster Management have been recognized nationally and internationally which are based on its first hand experience in implementing a series of projects on Disaster Management across the country over the last 18 years. NSC has been an APELL (Awareness and Preparedness for Emergencies at Local Level) partner of UNEP (United Nations Environment Programme) since 1992 and has pioneering contributions to its credit - establishment of the globally first National APELL Centre in 2002; successful handling of prestigious Govt. assignments - training on disaster management to regulatory agencies of the Gujarat Govt. & development of Off-site emergency plans; providing continued services to industry; developing and conducting 3-day International Workshop on Preparation of Emergency Plans for the APELL Project Officials from Sri Lanka. NSC has implemented a 2-year NSC-UNEP-EC Tsunami Project on "Disaster Risk Reduction through Awareness, Preparedness and Prevention Mechanism in Coastal Settlements in Tourist Destination – Kanniyakumari" as the National Partner of UNEP from Oct.06 to Dec.08.

Besides the statutory obligations placed on the management under various statutes on emergency management, Corporates have a key role and responsibility in this area as a part of their CSR in promoting awareness and strengthening disaster preparedness at the corporate & unit levels.

In view of the overwhelming response to the previsions workshops organized by NSC on Disaster Management, we are organizing this Workshop in Bengaluru in collaboration with our Karnataka Chapter. It is based on the experience gained through various disaster management activities and feedback received from earlier workshops of NSC.
